



The Bubbenhall 100 Club was established shortly after the Village Hall was opened in 1987. Its purpose is to provide a source of back-up funding for the non-recurrent expenditures of the Hall. Over more than 3 decades, the monies raised have helped to finance most of the extensions seen at the Hall, to enhancements such as renewed lighting, new furniture and other fittings, and most recently to a much-needed roof repair.

The Club initially issued 100 numbers (hence its name) each of which gave entry to 12 monthly draws with four prizes on offer each month, plus an occasional additional Christmas champagne prize. In the current year it has 208 numbers issued, each of which costs £12 per annum. The four monthly prizes have increased commensurately with the larger numbers and are currently £45, £35, £25 and £20. It is a legal requirement for the Club to return 60% of its takings in prizes with the balance being devoted wholly to the needs of the Hall. It is run entirely by volunteers and has no administrative expenses. The monthly draws run from September to August each year and are held typically in the Village Hall or the Malt Shovel on or near the first Friday of each month. Results are routinely published in the Village Newsletter.

New members are always welcome and additional numbers can be issued to accommodate them. Anyone requesting apply a number after the September start of each year will receive a discount on the £12 cost to reflect the smaller number of draws into which their number can be entered.
